J BLAKE RODMAN, DO **GASTROINTESTINAL PATHOLOGY**

Dr. Rodman joined Incyte Diagnostics in 2019. He is board certified in anatomic and clinical pathology.

Dr. Rodman graduated from University of Texas at Austin with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Ancient History and Classical Civilization. After several years working in a non-medical career, he then went on to attend from University of North Texas, Health Science Center in Fort Worth, Texas where he received his medical degree.

After obtaining his medical degree, Dr. Rodman completed his residency at Penrose-St. Francis Health Services in Colorado Springs, CO where he served as chief resident. He contributed to several multidisciplinary conferences at Penrose Hospital including GI and liver, thoracic, pulmonary and breast, and led a quality assurance project tasked with improving turnaround time for breast specimens. Additionally, he gained valuable experience while performing and evaluating over 200 bone marrows and aspirations.

Dr. Rodman then completed a gastrointestinal pathology fellowship in Cleveland, OH, under the directorship of Robert E. Petras, a world-renowned gastrointestinal pathologist. He received extensive training of Barrett's esophagus dysplasia, changes associated with primary inflammatory bowel disease, and all aspects of GI neoplastic and non-neoplastic diseases. He received training in liver pathology from Dr. Terry Gramlich. In addition, he received training in prostate pathology from Dr. Katherine Watts.
